Enhancing Comprehensive School Safety in Collaboration with Community in Hinthada Township

● Multi-purpose Hall as a Base of DRR for the Community

On the completion of school-cum-shelter with multi-purpose hall, SEEDS Asia and the Federation of Myanmar Engineering Societies (Fed. MES) jointly organised a grand opening ceremony to handover the buildings and equipment to school administration and disaster management committee of Nabekone Village on 2nd June, 2019. H.E. U Hla Moe Aung, Chief Minister for Ayeyarwady region and H.E. U Soe Aung, Deputy Minister of Ministry of Social Welfare and Relief and Resettlement, Dr. Hla Myat Twe, Ayeyarwady Regional Minister for Social Affairs, Parliament members, concerned government officials from Ministry of Education and Constructions at Regional, District and Township level, and around 400 community members and children participated the event. Individual donors for ramp construction and deep tube-well from both Myanmar and Japan also attended and could see their name on the list of contributors too. The event was broadcasted through Myanmar Radio and Television (MRTV) throughout the country, that conveyed the importance of comprehensive school safety approach. We heartily appreciate your kind cooperation and contribution in many ways for making this event possible!

● Training for Maintenance of School-com-shelter



Learning on how to use the filtration equipment for drinking water

A series of trainings for maintenance of facilities and equipment of the school-cum-shelter was held from 16th to 17th June. Whatever a person does not usually do cannot be done in emergencies, therefore day-by-day regular inspection and maintenance are necessary for appropriate emergency responses. The challenges are to maintain and utilise the filtration equipment for drinking water and solar panels installed to provide lights and water at the time of disasters in school-cum-shelter. The discussions and trainings for three days were conducted to; promote understanding of how to use equipment and facilities, establish the management structure to prevent and mitigate the loss of and damage to DRR equipment, and learn how to assist people who need help. Those rules and regulations will be on the bulletin board to acknowledge everyone. SEEDS Asia will put an effort to build more capacity of the school and the village before the rainy season comes.

● Workshop Organized by Swiss Agency for Development and Ministry of Education in Myanmar

SEEDS Asia with Fed. MES participated in the “Workshop on Improved School Design” which was organized by Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation with Ministry of Education in Myanmar to exchange and share good practices and challenges with other stakeholders for improving school design in Myanmar. Enhancement of the Effectiveness of DRR Emergency Warehouses [World Bank Urban Resilience Project]

● Urban Resilience Project – Dhaka North City Corporation

Dhaka North City Corporation (DNCC) is implementing the World Bank funded Urban Resilience Project since 2015. The project aims to enhance emergency response system and develop disaster response capacity of cities. Under the project, DNCC has built emergency warehouses in five zones in DNCC and 3 zones in Dhaka South City Corporation (DSCC) and procured various equipment and heavy vehicles. At a time of disaster, those warehouses will act as a response headquarters in the respective zones. DNCC is currently working on preparing zone disaster response plans and forming zone disaster management teams. A Zone disaster management team is going to be led by the Zone executive officer and consist of various cells such as medical, coordination, communication and information, dead body management, damage assessment, and security, to which the members will be appointed from different departments in zone offices.

SEEDS Asia is supporting DNCC to implement the project as a consultant. We provide zone officials and employees with a series of trainings on the basic of disaster risk reduction as well as roles of and facilities in the emergency warehouses. Also, we develop manuals and leaflets so that the warehouse can be utilized by zone offices and citizens not only in disaster times but also in peace time. The trainings will start in July and will be organized in DNCC, DSCC, and Sylhet City Corporation (SCC) in the next five months.

● United against Dengue Fever!



Rally raising awareness on prevention of dengue fever

The number of dengue cases is observed record high this year so far in Dhaka and it is still on the rise. According to Ministry of Family Welfare, 1,864 people were infected in May and June and three patients died. The number is three times higher as compared to last year. Experts say that there are several reasons for the dengue outbreak in the capital such as effects of climate change and intermitted rain, however, the biggest reason is lack of knowledge on the disease and prevention measures among citizens. Aedes mosquitoes that carry dengue are found more in the capital

and its eradication is a big and urgent challenge the city faces.

In such a critical situation, DRR communities that were born in our previous project in Dhaka (JICA Grassroots Project) is taking initiatives to fight dengue fever. To introduce some, Tejturibazar community conducted a rally to raise awareness on prevention especially not to keep stagnant water around home, construction sites, and markets. Also, having many people been affected last year, Monipuripara community sprayed mosquito medicine in their area, trying to minimize the risk and the number of infection cases this year. Elimination of the breeding ground and wiping out mosquito are city corporation’s responsibility, however, prevention requires everybody’s effort. It is so inspiring to see those communities working together to protect their own community.

Support Project on Promotion of School Disaster Risk Reduction and Management in Cebu Province

On 10th May, SEEDS Asia paid a courtesy call to Director Rebecca P. Geamala, the new director of Department of Social Welfare and Development Field Office 7. SEEDS Asia explained an overview of the organization, projects accomplished in the Philippines, and the current DRRM Project. She promised her cooperation and commitment to the Disaster Response and Evacuation Planning cum Workshop which started from 15th May as well as to the entire project.

● Disaster Response and Evacuation Planning cum Workshop



Discussing Disaster Response and Evacuation Plan

From 15th to 17th May, SEEDS Asia has organized a Disaster Response and Evacuation Planning cum Workshop in Cebu City with a cooperation of the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office of Cebu Province. From each pilot division, pilot school head, School Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (DRRM) coordinator, Parent-Teacher Association, Supreme Pupil Government, Local Government Unit DRRM officer, community, Philippine National Police (PNP), Bureau of Fire Protection, totaling more than 100 people participated. SEEDS Asia, School DRRM Instructing Team and Cebu Provincial DRRM Office facilitated the workshop. During the three-day workshop, each school worked on one hazard, and made disaster response plans including roles and responsibilities of teachers and other stakeholders, and evacuation plan, for three scenarios of “while inside school premises”, “while in transit to/from school”, and “during off-campus activities”. Each pilot area produced outputs, presented them and received comments from the facilitators. Schools will test the plans with simulation exercises which will be implemented starting from July.

Participants commented as the most significant learning from the program, “To be ready with the disaster by knowing the hazards around you and by knowing what to do and knowing the possible outcome of decisions”, “I have used my imagination to put myself in a situation which I have not experienced and encountered, but it was beneficial”, “I got familiarity and was able to equip myself against the unexpected natural and human induced worst scenarios and through this I can be a first responder of my community, school and to my family”. As for questions about what participants have learned and how it will help them with their work, SEEDS Asia received many positive comments to prove the workshop results such as “As a police officer, I have learned that on any types of disasters, we need to always have presence of mind. Other than that we the PNP will render our services 24/7 for successful disaster management that aims 0% casualties”, “I learned different strategies on how to manage the occurrence of disasters such as fire, earthquake, flood, etc.”, “It will help me in my work to make safer environment for the children”, “Ample knowledge/ideas were shaped using the different scenarios and workshops which cope with the needs and interest of the people involved on this training”, “Being a part of a DRR team we effectively apply the knowledge and skills not only in our district, but in the community and also to our family”, “For sure I can save more lives after this training”, “This seminar gave us the opportunity to build teamwork within the different agencies thus, it will improve our coordination and cooperation if a disaster occurs. It will make us one during operation.”

●Rice-planting Event

On 19th May, a rice-planting event was organized by a local group “PONPOKO” in Ichijima-cho, Tamba, in which SEEDS Asia also participated. This rice-planting event is a regular one held every year, but there was a little change this year: SEEDS Asia assisted in its promotion to a wider audience, as part of its study tour initiatives.

Family participants of 16 in total from big cities such as Kobe, Osaka and Sakai joined and made it a lively day. Aside from the rice-planting activity where participants were covered with mud, harvesting fresh vegetables and tasty lunch also followed. This was surely a rare experience for the participants residing in big cities, and they mentioned they would come back to Ichijima-cho if there will be another event like this.

●Turning Over Study Tour Operations

The goal of the Tamba City Promotion Partnership Project is to turn over the coordination work from SEEDS Asia to the local residents in Tamba, to make study tour operations more sustainable. On 24th May, a meeting was held with the residents to discuss registration of the local groups to a portal site that features experiential learning events. Future events and tours will be posted on the website and be known to a wider range of people, thus there will be no need for SEEDS Asia to cut in to coordinate between the visitors and the hosts.

●Lecture for Youth from ASEAN Countries and India at IATSS Forum

SEEDS Asia is honoured to be a lecturer for about 20 youth leaders in governments, entrepreneurship, medical and education sectors from ASEAN countries and India. This training session was organized by IATSS (International Association of Traffic and Safety Sciences, headquartered in Suzuka, Mie Pref.), and its participants are all high-spirited, strictly screened and selected members representing each country. They were in Kobe to learn about sustainable development and disaster risk reduction, in which Ms. Otsuyama Mitsuko of SEEDS Asia lectured about "Locally rooted support for disaster-affected communities - what it is to engage in disaster recovery as a third party -". The session was about the importance of self-help and mutual help as a lesson learned from the Great Hanshin-Awaji Earthquake, significance of civil participation in "Build Back Better", and what the participating members could refer to in their own initiatives, such as sample approaches, challenges and how to overcome those challenges.

The said training programme is held twice every year, and this was a fifth programme. We strongly hope that this young generation will surely pay attention to and prepare themselves in respective localities for possible disasters in the world where disaster frequency and impact are dramatically increasing.

●JICA Training Programme for Chile

On 17th June, SEEDS Asia had an opportunity to share our expertise at JICA Kansai as a part of the project to strengthen the organizational structure of National Office of Emergency of the Interior Ministry (ONEMI) for disaster risk reduction (DRR) in Chile, implemented by Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA). Ms. Otsuyama Mitsuko, SEEDS Asia, delivered a lecture with the title of "Awareness into Action" to approximately 10 officials from ONEMI, coordinated by OYO International Corporation which is taking charge of the project. SEEDS Asia introduced awareness programmes through Mobile Knowledge Resource Centre (MKRC) and DRR Activity Centres in Myanmar as examples of how to promote actions effectively toward DRR utilizing scientific data, and considering local culture and social background. Participants were highly motivated and told, "I would like to develop MKRC in my country because we already possess a routine truck for preservation of cultural heritages in remote areas."

As soon as we got to know their keen interests, we recorded an explanatory video on miniature models of MKRC in Spanish by one of SEEDS Asia staff, then we shared with them.
